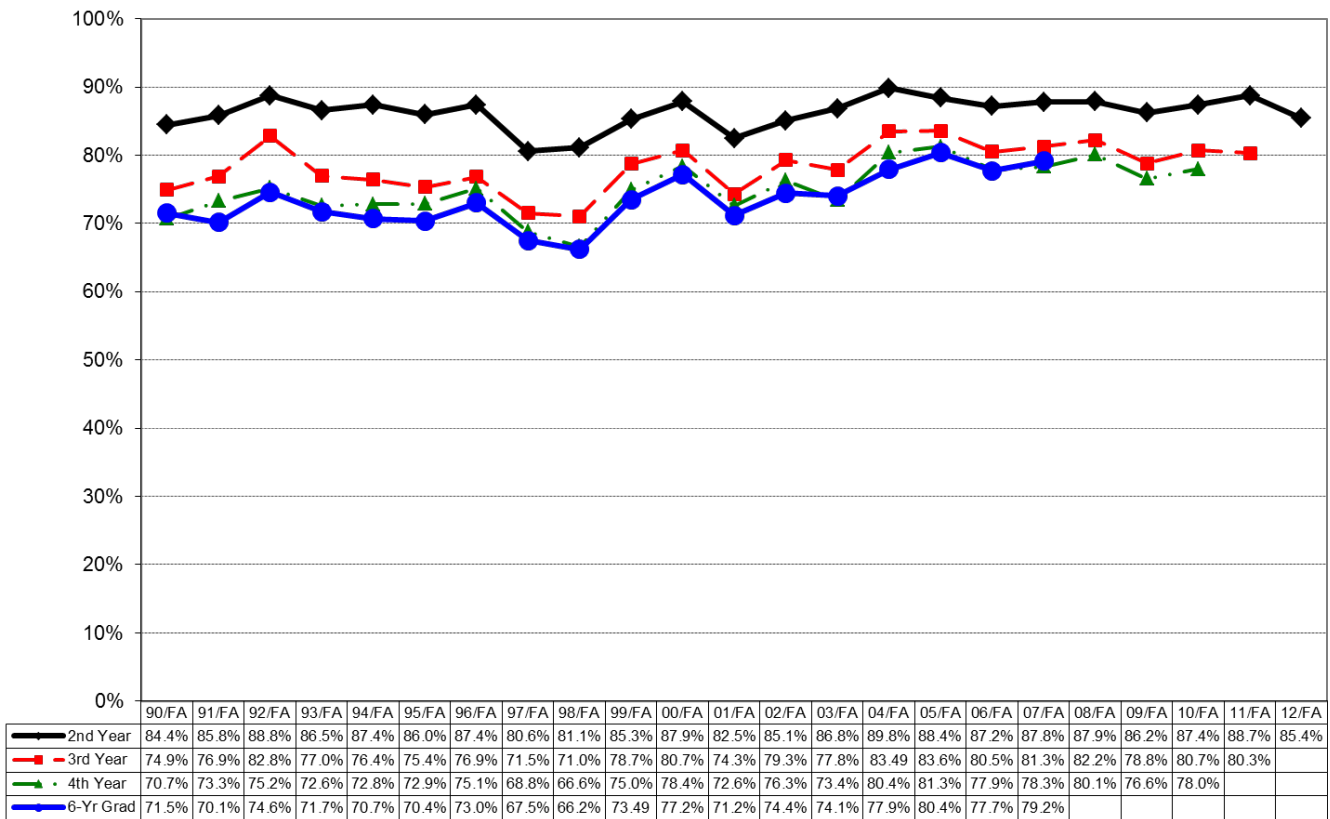


Allegheny’s most recent first-to-second-year retention percentage of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking freshman is 85%. The most recent six-year graduation rate is 79%.

The chart below depicts Allegheny’s historical retention and graduation percentages beginning with the cohort who entered in the fall 1990 semester. Included with the first-to-second year retention (in black) and the six-year graduation rate (in blue) are the first-to-third and first-to-fourth-year retention rates (in red and green respectively).

Since preparing students to enroll in another Title IV HEA-eligible institution is *not* part of Allegheny’s mission, transfer-out rates are not calculated.
