- Glib and disappointing ("PowerPointlessness").
- Worst case: "PowerPointing" a goal in itself; more attention on special effects than issues.
- Best case: presentation enhances and communicates larger body of work.



Eliminate Distractions

Flashing slides with many different transitions, Flash! dazzling sound effects and gimmicks of various kinds can Flash! distract the audience from the argument being Flash! made or the evidence Flash! being presented.

Students must learn *Flash!* to settle for a few special effects *Flash!* and put most of their *Flash!* energy in persuasion. The best presentation is the most persuasive, not *Flash!* the most dazzling.





Avoid Complex Figures
