Purpose:

An examination of how knights and concubines serve as contrasting icons of Chinese culture. Through the use of fiction, film and research work, this course will show how both groups have been historically constructed and reinterpreted in the 20th century as exotic and mythical symbols in Chinese and Western minds. Upon completing this course, students will acquire a unique perspective to understand Chinese history as well as Chinese counterculture and values different from mainstream historical narrative.
