

What are Gator Days?

Tuesday, October 23rd is the date set for the first Allegheny College Gator Day. According to Terry Bensel, Associate Dean of the College, "At its most basic level, Gator Days are meant to "clear the calendar" so that we can have a day for a whole variety of academic and co-curricular planning on campus." The Gator Day idea originated in Curriculum Committee discussions regarding changes to the academic calendar. After an initial motion to change the academic calendar was voted down by the faculty at the end of the 2010–11 academic year the Curriculum Committee, with strong support from its student members, introduced a new motion at the November 2011 faculty meeting. This second motion (which passed unanimously at the December 9, 2011 faculty meeting) involved more minor changes to the academic calendar, but still included the idea of setting aside one day each semester for "all campus programming" (aka Gator Days) Gator Days, as described in the Curriculum Committee proposal, are envisioned as providing an opportunity for "student-centered programming that will create a greater sense of campus community" and will be considered a major campus event.
